## Pierced Ears

When considering having your child's ears pierced, please note that children must remove any earrings before their PE and games lessons. They need to be able to do this themselves or they need to be removed at home prior to school. If the child is unable to remove earrings then they must be securely covered with surgical tape before children arrive at school (with the exception of swimming, when we do not allow any jewellery to be worn).

This is health and safety guidance that all schools and sports organisations must follow.

PE is part of the national curriculum and it is not optional for children, therefore, please choose carefully when your child has their ears pierced and be ready to follow these rules. Thank you.
