What impact/intended impact/sustainability

How will you know? What **evidence** do you have or expect to have?

- Children will be more physically active. Regular physical activity has been shown to improve academic achievement and reduce stress and anxiety and therefore, helping to ensure there is an increase in regular physical activity will help with whole school improvement, both academically and mental health and wellbeing.
- PE subject lead/teaching staff will be kept informed of any changes ensuring they have the required skills and knowledge to teach PE and sport.
- The school will have the PE equipment needed to teach the full PE curriculum and to enable all children to fully participate.
- By increasing the number of matches and competitions, it will increase physical activity and give children the opportunity to try sports they may not have otherwise tried.
- By providing CPD opportunities for staff they will gain the skills, knowledge and confidence to teach every area of the PE curriculum.
- Purchase PE educational platform to engage all children by providing fun and engaging activities.
- Children will meet/exceed the national curriculum requirement for swimming and gain the skills to stay safe in the water.

- Positive pupil feedback and observations of increased physically active opportunities for all pupils. Children will associate physical activity with fun, helping to encourage future participation.
- ➤ PE subject lead/teaching staff will feel more confident to teach PE and sport.
- All equipment needed to teach PE and sport will be available. There will be enough equipment for all children to participate at the same time.
- Physical activity will increase and children will have the opportunity to try different sports and play competitively.
- Learning will be shared with other staff. Staff voice and lesson observations will show that staff are competent and confident with teaching the PE curriculum.
- Pupil voice will show that children are enjoying PE lessons. Children make progress.
- Children will be able to say how to stay safe in the water.
- Children will meet/exceed the national curriculum requirement for swimming.
